

## Dog Leash Reminder

We recently had a complaint from a resident after he was threatened by an off-leash dog that the owner couldn't control. When walking your dog, remember that not everybody is comfortable around dogs. It is your responsibility to ensure that your dog does not threaten or frighten other walkers. When walking on Saanich trails, your dog may be off-leash but it must be under effective control.

When walking in or on the trails of the Royal Oak Burial Park (shown as purple lines within the light green area on the map), your dog must be on a leash. (Saanich Bylaw 8556)
