Pat Bay Highway Noise Attenuation Petition

At our Falaise Community Association AGM last November a number of our members voiced their concerns with our guest speaker the Hon. Lana Popham Minister of Agriculture, regarding the increasing noise levels from the Pat Bay Highway and its impact on the residents along Falaise Drive and vicinity. The residents requested that a berm or barrier be installed adjacent to Falaise Drive to alleviate the noise concerns.

The Minister suggested that we start by getting the residents to sign a petition supporting the need for such a barrier, with this petition to be presented by the Falaise Community Association (FCA) to the Minister, who would then organize a Public Meeting with the Transportation Ministry in the New Year.

In January and February of this year, a group of volunteers visited all of the 176 addresses included in the Falaise area. Three of these addresses represent businesses while the rest are residences. We were able to speak with someone at 141 of these locations and obtained 243 signatures from individuals in favour of the petition. Of those contacted, 88% were in favour of the petition, indicating that highway noise is a significant concern for those represented by the FCA.

We have now delivered the petition to Minister Popham and she will be discussing it with her colleague from the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure. We will keep you posted as to future developments.

Falaise Park Restoration Work Parties

Work parties were held March 29th and May 10th to begin the process of pulling out the invasive plants that have been slowly taking over and displacing the native vegetation of Falaise Park. A crew of keen volunteers have made a good start clearing away the blackberry bushes, English ivy and periwinkle near the playground. The work is being carried out under the auspices of Saanich Parks volunteer Pulling Together Program. Parks has appointed local resident and FCA director Stuart Macpherson as the volunteer Park Steward. Stuart has prepared a Park Restoration Plan with the objective of stopping the spread of invasive plants

and restoring the Park's vegetation to its natural state as a Garry Oak meadow ecosystem. Planting of native trees and shrubs is to follow as the invasive species are removed.

More work parties are being planned. If you want to see those wonderful camas lilies and chocolate lilies flowering in profusion again under the oak trees and are interested in helping out please contact Stuart at 250-479-4244.

The Falaise Community Association has a healthy bank balance of slightly more than \$5,000. We have earmarked some of this money to pay for tools and native plants as part of the park restoration project. We might also need to pay a consultant when developing a plan for the highway noise barrier. What other projects would you like to have the association fund?

Ideas that have been raised include providing nesting places for native bees (bee hotels) in the park (Saanich has approved this in principle but would need to approve plans and would require us to maintain the nest sites) and coordinating residents' development of pollinator gardens (perhaps hiring a consultant and/or paying for seeds).

Become a member


