#### Lana Popham Open House

We attended the December Holiday Open House hosted by Saanich South MLA and Minister of Agriculture, Lana Popham. In addition to hot apple cider, there was tea, coffee and a range of treats ranging from cheese and crackers to fancy squares. There were perhaps thirty people at the event so it was small enough for Lana to personally meet almost everyone. We reminded Lana about the petition we had submitted regarding traffic noise and options for a noise wall. Lana and her assistant were knowledgeable about the issue. Lana promised to work with the FCA and Saanich Council to see what options may be available.



Last year we again expressed concern to Saanich about the **speed of traffic around the park**. We are

concerned about cars going too fast on a curved road with poor visibility near the playground and where pedestrians walk in the street to avoid parked cars. To investigate the problem, Saanich police installed a speed monitoring device at the west side of the park. The results are posted on the Saanich police website (saanichpolice.ca under Speed Reports). Unfortunately the monitoring device seems to have included the speed of walkers into the average speed reported (26.7 km/hr). Also, the sign could be seen from the stop sign. Its visibility may have caused drivers to slow

down. We have written to the police about this.




In December we met with Mayor Haynes. Although the main focus of the meeting was how to **mitigate the highway traffic noise** for residents and businesses, the 855 Falaise Cres rezoning was also discussed. After reviewing various options, the Mayor proposed that the FCA make a request to appear as a delegation before Council. Such delegations are given 10 minutes to make a presentation and we will use our time to outline the need for noise mitigation, review the results of the petition, and ask Saanich Council to work with Lana Popham and the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure to get a noise barrier installed. We have requested to appear at the January 21 Council meeting.



Thank you to all the volunteers who worked on the park last year. We continue to make good progress in removing invasive plants and noxious weeds. This past fall we cleared along the eastern fence line and

spread mulch ready for planting with native shrubs. Our native plant order for this has been submitted to Saanich Parks. They will be helping us with the planting in the New Year.

The little white flags along the mulch edge beside the playground are where we have sowed seeds of deer resistant wildflower species. Saanich Parks will be monitoring the success of the seeding. Hopefully we will get good germination in the spring. Work parties will commence in late January and continue though the spring. Check the FCA website for dates. Our next task is eliminating the English ivy and blackberry on the north boundary. Call Stuart Macpherson if interested in helping.



#### Fire Hall Upgrade

Fire Station #2 is being redeveloped. It is over 40 years old and needs upgrades to continue to provide the best service to everyone in Saanich. The upgrade will include a new training area, a larger building and altering the entrance/exit layout. Right now you can give your input into the plan and see the changes being discussed. #### Annual General Meeting

In November, we held our Annual General Meeting; the first since updating our constitution in June. At the meeting we reviewed our finances, set the membership fee at \$5/person, reviewed the year's activities, and elected people to the Board of Directors. In an inspiring presentation from Mike Meagher (Garry Oak Preservation Society), he described how vital the Garry Oaks are to our region, and the need to protect and save them. His main points were about how Garry Oaks provide neccessary vegetation to our ecosystem and reduce stress in our community. Details of the AGM and Mike's presentation are available on our website.
