

A framework and formality is now in place that ensures continuity of the group and empowers the volunteers to effective service. The political model that suggests that an elected official should not serve more than eight consecutive years is a valid notion. Leadership can become stale, experiencing a loss of spirit. My eight years of service has brought me to a place where I feel it is time for a fresh approach, one with a new fire to take emerging projects to completion. Confident that the FCA is embarking on a season of renewal, I turn over the reigns to the new Executive Board.

Recreation Infrastructure Canada (RinC) Program

The District of Saanich, specifically Saanich Parks and Recreation, received a grant to upgrade many parks in our municipality including Falaise Park. RinC is a Federal government economic stimulus program designed to invest in the local parks infrastructure. At Falaise Park, a new playground and restoration of the old playground site will be completed during the fall of 2010. Saanich will relocate the playground to make better use of the space within the park, as well as encouraging native plant growth under the Garry Oak canopy. The RinC grant is a tremendous opportunity for an upgrade of our park, and we are excited to be included.

In preparation for the revitalization, work sessions in the park are scheduled as part of our ongoing park stewardship commitment. Resident Alan Taylor initiated Saturday April 17thas the first round with FCA Executive Board members and residents removing a considerable amount of invasive broom and other species. The piles of debris on the exterior edge will be picked up by Saanich Parks over the weeks to come. A further schedule will be drafted by the new Executive Board and shared with the community regarding future activity. Falaise Park is a real jewel, and with our combined efforts, everyone can enjoy it.



The plans for Falaise Park are more then five years in the making with active partnership with Saanich Parks. At the FCA Annual General Meeting (AGM) on May 3rd, 2005, the need to focus on Falaise Park was identified. The community was challenged to think of ways to improve our park and reflect on how the current status was not fully meeting the needs of our community. Falaise Park was, and is, a park with rocky outcrops, floral meadows and a Garry Oak canopy that is suited to low impact usage such as walking, photography and similar activities that provide enjoyment for all members of the Saanich Community. With the need to know what we have in the park, Dr. Hans Roemer was contracted to map out and inventory the plant life in the park through a 2006 Centennial Grant from Saanich. With his report, input from the community and Saanich Parks, the condition of the play equipment and the native floral species under the Garry Oak canopy become our focus areas. Feedback received over the past years has been that moving the play area to the lower section provides greater accessibility for strollers, children on wheeled play equipment, and seniors with mobility issues. The process of the FPRP fully honoured that all park improvements would take into consideration the sensitive Garry Oak ecosystems that are present in Falaise Park. The plans for revitalization to the Park were stalled until the RinC Program became available through the Federal Government. Come to this year's AGM to learn more!











FALAISE DRIVE BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT

The Falaise Drive corridor along the Pat Bay Highway has been of interest to residents for more than 10 years. The area where the road circles up the hill is a zone that presents an unattended profile, as well as a safety risk. In 2002 the late Ron Timms began the campaign to consider some sort of barrier between the community and this fast paced thoroughfare. The most favoured idea that came forth was planting trees and creating a small green space. The addition of natural vegetation to this area would assist in reducing air and noise pollution and would provide a safety zone. A plan for a greenbelt utilizing the existing pathway was conceived and the Falaise Drive Beautification Project (FDBP) was born. The FCA Executive Board looked at opportunities for funding through the Greenways Program, but were unable to secure a grant in that year. The zest to expand and cultivate this project was lost with Ron's passing. The project experienced a rebirth when Colin Boog moved into the Falaise Community in 2005 with his family and saw the same deficiencies in this setting. Elected to the FCA Executive Board in 2007, Colin championed a revival of the FDRP at the 2008 AGM requesting we contract a professional for a design plan. Colin and FCA Treasurer Margaret Klatt commissioned a landscape architect who produced the drawing we provide below. Residents have demonstrated their excitement about this project, and some have already stepped forth financially and sponsored a tree. With an active project on the go in the community, the FCA Executive Board has suspended movement on this project until they can apply their full attention to this endeavour. 
