SCAN report: Mac

- 1. Reports on Meetings from April 6th and May 4th.
 - a) Apr. 6 discussions on proposed development corridors no firm info
 - b) May 4th presentation by Ian Gibbs Crime Prevention coordinator for Block Watch. Block Watch has been defunded by Saanich Police. As there is no police liaison officer assigned to the group, everything goes through Ian Gibbs now.
 - c) Festival committee continues to work on the July 9th community event.
 - d) There is a posting out for the new director of planning; SCAN has requested organization charts from Saanich.
 - e) Saanich is currently reviewing garden suites.

Community Survey 2022 draft review: Stuart

- Suggestion was made to add a question asking if residents are interested in becoming a director (or rework question 17)
- 2. Question 16 change wording "complaint" to "suggestion"
- 3. Carl and Bob to collaborate in putting it on Lime Survey
- 4. The survey will be sent out to the community next month

Committee reports / actions:

- 1. Noise Wall (Stew)
 - a) Jesse Green (Lana's assistant) is setting up a meeting between Lana, Rob Fleming and some MoTI staff to meet with Stuart and Stew on-site on May 27th (date tentative).
 - b) Highways flyover project will be out for tender soon and hopefully begin by year end.
- 2. Membership Drive 2022 (Mac)
 - a) In progress
 - b) Last year: 210. So far this year: 207 as of May 11th
 - c) End call-backs at end of May; new members welcome throughout the year
- 3. Road Mural (Stuart)
 - a) Action plan was circulated via email by Stuart.
 - b) August 13th is proposed painting date; backup date will be August 20th

 - a) One sign has disappeared. Bob has soil anchors to secure remaining sign

- 3. Community Garage Sale 9:00 am 1:00 pm Sat May 14th preparation details were reviewed
 - a) Bob will forward the route map to Carl to post on our Facebook site
 - b) 13 houses have signed up
 - c) It was not advertised in the Saanich News as only 4 had signed up by deadline. It will be advertised in the Times-Colonist and on Kijiji.
 - d) Bob will make up display boards to be set on strategic corners on the morning of the sale.
- 4. Meet and Greet BBQ May 14th 4:00 pm 6:00 preparation details were reviewed
 - a) Preparation document was sent to board members via email
 - b) Location: proposed for playground area so that parents can watch children on playground as they socialize; As Mac is concerned that there is not enough space, Stew and Mac will measure area and make final decision on Thursday morning.
 - c) Stew, Carl and Mac (if available) will set up the site on Saturday morning and post directional signs in the old meeting area if the playground area is deemed suitable.
 - d) Minor adjustments made to planning checklist to be sent out to all directors Thursday.
 - e) Scavenger hunt for children was proposed and approved. Holly to coordinate.
 - f) The proposed budget limits for this event were reviewed and a new motion made. Motion: Move that the FCA approve a budget of \$400.00 for food purchases and \$100.00 for prizes, for a total of \$500.00.

- 5. FCA wish list ideas (follow-up)
 - a) Response from Parks department re proposal for additional swing or picnic table. It does not appear that adding a new swing is feasible, however there may be an opportunity to add a picnic table to the top area. Stuart to follow up with Saanich Park

- 1. Report on Economic Resilience meeting with BARA, FCA, ROCA, and Saanich senior staff (the mayor, CAO and EDM). (Mac)
 - a) Chaired by the mayor held at Stew Vinnel's home
 - b) The mayor introduced the new economic development manager, Mitchell Edgar
 - c) The focus was on information gathering: determine what the CAs need, what Saanich is doing well, etc.
- 2. Advertising in Falaise Focus and Facebook discussion
 - a) Request from resident (member of FCA) to advertise his business

- b) It was noted that question 14 currently included in the upcoming community survey addresses this issue; therefore, the board will wait for the survey results before making a final decision.
- c) A recommendation was put forward that only paid-up members be allowed to advertise if we were to move forward on this.
- 3. Support for harassed resident on Falaise Crescent
 - a) Harassment appears to be conducted by teenagers. No property damage was incurred.
 - b) The first Incident was reported to police by the homeowners but not the second incident. They were encouraged to do so.
 - c) As policing this type of activity doesn't fall within the FCA mandate, we need to renew a focus on promoting Block Watch communications. We can also offer individual support by encouraging residents to report any suspicious activity to the police.
- 4. Calendar review we will begin initial planning for our summer picnic at June's meeting
- 5. Block Watch
 - a) It appears that Block Watch is currently in a state of flux. Mac will contact Ian Gibb, coordinator, to ask him to attend our next FCA meeting to clarify the role of Block Watch in our community.
